Thursday September 19, 2024 at 10:30

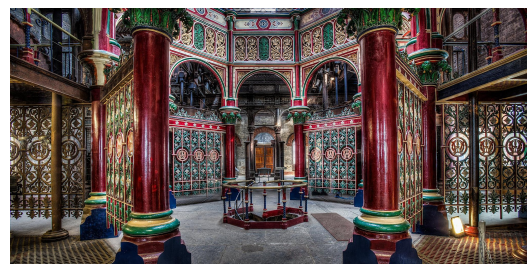
A Victorian Masterpiece of engineering and architecture built by Sir Joseph Bazalgette to deal with London's sewage.

We will have an illustrated talk giving the historical context and the build up to the Great Stink of 1858.

A guided tour of the Crossness site and engines, opened in 1865 and decommissioned in the 1970's.

The group will be free to explore the Great Stink Exhibition, enjoy the impressive Victorian ironwork and the wonderful collection of toilets.
